Of the 178 Juveniles arrested during the year 1960, 150 of them were released to their parents after arrest. Of these 150, 88 were referred to the Juvenile Court for further action and the remaining 62 were left for paternal correction.

Of the 178 Juveniles arrested 22 were placed in the King County Juvenile Youth Center for detention after arrest. 1 was returned to the Green Hill Academy for Boys and 5 were turned over to other agencies.

Of these 4 were sent back to the Bellevue Municipal Court for adult prosecution and 1 was sent to the King County Jail and the case turned over to the King County Prosecutors Office to stand adult prosecution on a felony charge.
