

# **Traffic Analysis Report 2020-002** SE 55th Street between 169th Place SE and 171st Avenue SE



Thank you for contacting the City of Bellevue with your concerns about vehicle speeds on SE 55th Street.

After conducting a field review and speed and volume studies, we have compiled the data and our recommendations into this Traffic Analysis Report.

Please review the summary of findings and our recommendation on the next pages.



You specifically were concerned about vehicle speeds on SE 55th Street. The roadway grade on SE 55th Street is too steep to meet our guidelines for the installation of speed humps.

# Our findings include:

 SE 55th Street has a SPEED LIMIT 25 sign and 25 mph pavement markings to notify motorists of the 25 mph speed limit. The City of Bellevue has a radar feedback speed sign program in which proposed locations are ranked based on roadway characteristics including speeds, traffic volumes, reported collisions, existing traffic calming measures, and walkability. These characteristics are analyzed to help determine the ranking of requested locations amongst other candidate locations. Projects are selected based on the ranking of the location and available resources for new projects every two years. We have added SE 55th Street to our radar feedback speed sign candidate location list, and it will be analyzed during our next review period.

 We recommend you utilize our yard signs to help encourage motorists to respect the speed limit. We encourage you to speak with your neighbors about the included education program recommendations. # Summary of Findings

Below is a summary of the data we collected on SE 55th Street between 169th Place SE and 171st Avenue SE from 8/4/2020 to 8/10/2020.



## **Road Characteristics**

SE 55th Street is approximately 35 ft wide. There is an asphalt sidewalk on the north side of the street.




#### **Residential Street**

SE 55th Street is located in Lakemont with a speed limit of 25 mph.

#### **Daily Traffic**


The mid-week daily average traffic on SE 55th Street is 1,154 cars per day. Mid-week average includes data between Tuesday and Thursday for both directions of travel.





### **Speed Study**

When measuring vehicle speed, we use a metric called the 85th percentile speed. This speed, shown to the right, represents the speed at which 85% of all vehicles recorded are traveling at or below during our speed study.



# **Collision History**

A three-year collision study was conducted on SE 55th Street between 169th Place SE and 171st Avenue SE.

FINDINGS: There were no reported collisions.

# Summary of Recommendations

Below are our recommendations for SE 55th Street between 169th Place SE and 171st Avenue SE based on the field reviews, data collection, and analysis. By educating the community and encouraging safe driving, we can begin to change driver behavior and reduce vehicle speeds.





# Traffic Safety Yard Signs

# **Traffic Enforcement**



The Transportation Department works closely with the Bellevue Police Department to enforce speed limits and other traffic laws in neighborhoods. Using key traffic data provided by Transportation staff, officers focus their scheduled patrols on the times and places where speeding most often occurs. Typically, targeted enforcement occurs during a one-week timeframe. Enforcement is also available by request. To request enforcement, go to BellevueWA.gov/tsr or call 425-577-5656.
