Please help the environment

Changing oil and servicing cars provides a needed service for your community. Properly disposing of used filters and oil also provides a needed service for them and for the environment.

O'Reilly's and Auto Zone in Bellevue will recycle these materials for you.



REMINDER: Leaving used oil and oil filters on private property violates city codes and can result in cumulative daily fines up to \$500 per day. (BCC 9.10.030.B.3 and 9.11.030.B.3)



HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

- Antifreeze
- Brake fluid
- Car batteries
- Carburetor cleaner
- Engine degreaser
- Flares
- Gasoline
- Transmission fluid
- Used oil
- Used oil filters

PROPERLY DISPOSE OF HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

Automotive repair generates more hazardous materials than just used oil and used oil filters. The items listed above, and more, require proper handling and disposal.

Improperly disposing of auto-related substances, including water from car washing, is not allowed in the city's storm and surface water system (nothing but rain down the storm drain). *Bellevue Storm and Surface Water Code 24.06.125*

FREE SMALL BUSINESS HAZARDOUS DISPOSAL

This service is limited to Small Quantity Generator (SQG) businesses in King County.

Businesses must fill out a Business Disposal Form prior to drop off, apps.lhwmp.org/sqgselfserve.

This service is available to small businesses that produce less than 220 pounds, about 25 gallons, of hazardous waste each month and can be used a maximum of four times per year.
