

Traffic Analysis Report 2022-003 SE Allen Road east of 146th Avenue SE



April 2022

Thank you for contacting the City of Bellevue with your concerns about vehicle speeds on SE Allen Road.

After conducting a field review and speed and volume studies, we have compiled the data and our recommendations into this Traffic Analysis Report.

Please review the summary of findings and our recommendations on the next pages.



You specifically were concerned about vehicle speeds on SE Allen Road. To address this concern, you suggested speed bumps and radar feedback speed signs.

Our findings include:

- When considering a street for traffic calming measures such as the installation of speed humps, we look at a series of roadway characteristics including vehicle speeds, traffic volumes, reported collisions, proximity to schools, and walkability. These characteristics are analyzed to determine the location's ranking amongst other candidate locations. Every two years, staff review the list of candidate locations and their ranking to select the projects that will move forward depending on available funding. We have added SE Allen Road to the list for consideration.
- The City of Bellevue also has a stationary radar sign program. This program has a similar format to that

of requests for traffic calming measures, where locations are ranked amongst other candidate locations for stationary radar signs. Projects are selected based on the ranking of the location and available resources for new projects every two years. We have added SE Allen Road to our stationary radar sign candidate location list, and it will be analyzed during our next review period.

We recommend you utilize our yard signs or radar dolly to help encourage motorists to respect the speed limit. We encourage you to speak with your neighbors about the included education program recommendations. Summary of Findings

Below is a summary of the data we collected on SE Allen Road 3/16/2022 to 3/22/2022.



Road Characteristics

SE Allen Road is a collector arterial with parking allowed on the north side of the street. The south side of the street includes a bike lane for eastbound bicyclists and a pedestrian walkway. Shared lane markings (sharrows) are marked for westbound bicyclists.




Collector Arterial

SE Allen Road is a collector arterial in Eastgate with a speed limit of 25 mph.



Daily Traffic


The mid-week daily average traffic on SE Allen Road is 850 cars per day. Mid-week average includes data between Tuesday and Thursday for both directions of travel.





Speed Study

When measuring vehicle speed, we use a metric called the 85th percentile speed. This speed, shown to the right, represents the speed at which 85% of all vehicles recorded are traveling at or below during our speed study.





Collision History

A three-year collision study was conducted on SE Allen Road from 146th Avenue SE to 149th Avenue SE.

FINDINGS: There were no reported collisions.

Summary of Recommendations

Below are our recommendations for SE Allen Road based on the field reviews, data collection, and analysis. More detail on these recommendations are outlined in the Residential Traffic Guidebook (BellevueWA.gov/ ResidentialTrafficGuidebook). By educating the community and encouraging safe driving, we can begin to change driver behavior and reduce vehicle speeds.

Traffic Safety Yard Signs



This program involves lending communities portable signs that encourage motorists to respect the neighborhood, drive responsibly, and drive 25 mph.

Radar Dolly



You can borrow and place a radar dolly on your street for up to two weeks. This unit gives motorists feedback on the speed at which they are driving on a digital reader board, encouraging them to obey the speed limit. Should you like to borrow the radar dolly, please request it by calling 425-452-6457 or sign up on BellevueWA.gov/RadarDolly. Once we receive a request, city staff will contact you to make arrangements for both the drop-off and pick-up of the radar dolly at your home.



Traffic Enforcement



The Transportation Department works closely with the Bellevue Police Department to enforce speed limits and other traffic laws in neighborhoods. Using key traffic data provided by Transportation staff, officers focus their scheduled patrols on the times and places where speeding most often occurs. Typically, targeted enforcement occurs during a one-week timeframe. Enforcement is also available by request. To request enforcement, go to BellevueWA.gov/TSR or call 425-577-5656.
