City of Bellevue

Ordinance No. 6128 of the City of Bellevue, Washington, adopting interim official zoning controls to address impacts resulting from the rental of multiple rooms in single-family dwellings to unrelated individuals, by amending the definitions of “boarding house” and “family” and creating a new definition of “rooming house”, for a period of six months, to be in effect while the City drafts, considers, holds hearings, and adopts permanent regulations, to be effective immediately upon adoption, scheduling a hearing on the maintenance of the interim zoning ordinance, providing for severability, and declaring an emergency.
