Ordinance No. 6152 extending Ordinance No. 6128 adopting an interim official zoning ordinance to address impacts resulting from the rental of multiple rooms in residential dwellings to unrelated individuals, by amending the definitions of "boarding house" and "family" and creating a new definition of "rooming house", for an additional period of six months, to be in effect while the City drafts, considers, holds hearings, and adopts permanent regulations; providing for severability; and establishing an effective date.

(On November 4, 2013, Council adopted Ordinance No. 6128 initiating interim zoning controls regulating individual room rentals in residential dwellings. Should Council determine to not extend the interim controls, these regulations will no longer be in effect after March 23, 2014.)
