*Consideration of the application of Bellevue School District 405 is for a Conditional Use Permit to demolish the present one-story Sammamish High School and to build a new three-story high school facility on the same site. The new academic building will be wrapped around the existing 18,000 square-foot Performing Arts Center which will remain. The site is located at 100 140th Avenue SE and is in the jurisdiction of the East Bellevue Community Council. File No. 12-117732 LB.

> This is a Process III application, the site is located in the East Bellevue Community Council (EBCC) area.
