





### **Bellevue Neighborhood Traffic Safety Project**

Tyee Middle School & Eastgate Community
Traffic Safety Survey Analysis

#### **Survey Participants**

The survey yielded 118 responses from participants who live near, travel by, and/or have children who attend Tyee Middle School (TMS). Sixty-three percent (63%) of respondents live near TMS, compared to 44% who live near Newport Heights Elementary School and 42% near Newport High School. Of survey respondents, 51% have children attending a school in the area.

#### **Transportation Modes**

Children's transportation modes to and from school differ from the overall transportation modes of the adult survey participants, with students incorporating more active travel (walking, biking, etc.) into their routines compared to adults in the area.

#### **Student Transportation Modes**

Forty-seven percent (47%) of survey participants who have children in school drive their children to school. Children who do not receive rides from their family either walk (11%), take the school bus (7%), carpool (3%) and/or bicycle (2%). No survey respondents reported their children take public transit. Some high school age children drive themselves to their schools.


#### **Adult Transportation Modes**

Ninety-one percent (91%) of adult survey participants rely on driving their personal vehicle for the majority of their transportation trips, whereas 3% rely on public transit, 3% walk, and 3% carpool. No respondents bike. Of the adults who drop their children at school using their personal vehicle, 43% proceed to work, 35% return home, 12% drop off another child at a different school and 6% run errands.

The respondent's primary reasons for relying heavily on personal vehicles include feeling that transit service does not meet their needs (53%), having complex schedules (49%), liking being in their own car (25%), and not feeling safe biking (14%) or walking (12%). See figure A for further details.




#### **Areas of Concern**


The survey asked participants to identify three main challenges to walking or biking in the Eastgate neighborhood around Tyee Middle School. The five most commonly cited concerns include (Figure B):

- Lack of sidewalks or that sidewalks are not continuous (56%)
- Poor driving behavior (39%)
- Takes too long to walk or bike to destinations (34%)
- High traffic speeds (32%)
- Intersections are dangerous to cross (27%)

When asked to identify three locations posing the highest safety concerns in the areas proximate to the school, 58% cited the intersection of the main school driveway and SE Allen Road and 55% selected the vicinity of Edgebrook Swim Club Driveway on SE Allen Road. The third most common concern was the intersection of SE 40<sup>th</sup> St and 138<sup>th</sup> AVE SE (42%) followed by the east side of the school property on 138<sup>th</sup> AVE SE between SE 40<sup>th</sup> ST and SE Allen Rd 32%). #### **Community Suggestions**

Fifty-nine participants provided comments or suggestions about student transportation and safe walking and biking in their neighborhood. Car traffic and speeding along SE Allen Rd were the most common concerns, especially as a risk to students and residents walking along this road without sidewalks. In addition to pedestrian concerns along Allen Road, survey participants noted concern about the lack of continuous sidewalks along SE Newport Way connecting the school, library and community center.

The traffic circle intersection of SE 40<sup>th</sup> St and 138<sup>th</sup> AVE SE was commonly cited as another point of concern, where individuals fail to yield or slow. Respondents posed various solutions to this intersection, including reverting to the four-way stop, adding flashing lights and/or lit cross walks, and clearly marking right of ways.

Other suggestions include increasing lighting, specifically on Allen Road between 138<sup>th</sup> AVE SE and 140<sup>th</sup> AVE SE, creating dedicated bike lanes and inviting police to enforce traffic laws during morning drop off.




# Q1 Which school(s) do you travel to, live nearby, or travel close by? (Select all that apply)



### Q2 If you have a child attending one or more schools listed in Question 1, how does your child most commonly get to and from school?





# Q3 If you or a family member drives your child to school, what do you/family member do after the morning drop-off?





# Q4 For the majority of your other transportation trips, what mode do you most commonly use?










