

What is Vision Zero?



A multi-national traffic safety strategy to eliminate all traffic fatalities and severe injuries, while increasing safe, healthy, equitable mobility for all.

- Recognizes traffic fatality and injuries are the results of crashes and are preventable
- Sets timeline to aggressively eliminate both
- Focused on strategic and measurable goals, and driven by data
- Takes a multidisciplinary approach

Traffic deaths in New York City (the earliest U.S. adopter of Vision Zero) are down 22% since 2013, just before the city launched Vision Zero. Pedestrian deaths dropped to a record low in New York City in 2015.



Collision Data




**Every 17 days,


All Collisions Versus KSI Collisions by Mode


