Meydenbauer Bay Park and Land Use Plan

This Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) analyzes the effects of adopting a Master Plan and related comprehensive Plan, Land Use Code, and Zoning Map amendments for the Meydenbauer Park and Land Use Plan. The project study area is bounded by 98th Place NE/Meydenbauer Beach Park on the west, NE 1st Street on the north, 101st Avenue SE on the east, and Meydenbauer Way SE and Meydenbauer Bay on the south. The City owns approximately ten acres of property within this area, along or in close proximity to the shoreline of Meydenbauer Bay. The DEIS assesses the impacts of the three optional ways that the area could develop between now and 2020 (two "action alternatives" and one "no action alternative"). Public input on the DEIS, and the document itself, will help the project steering committee develop a preferred alternative, anticipated this summer. The steering committee will make a recommendation, which will be reflected in a Final EIS (FEIS), which will be published prior to the City Council taking action on the proposal.
