


Park Program Elements

- Fully day-lighted stream with interpretive/education nodes along adjacent
- Ravine enhancements (Contiguous canopy forested areas to be retained and enhanced; invasive plants removed)
- Relocated Wetland (Incorporation of wetlands with the stream/shoreline delta to form a contiguous surface water structure)
- Water detention features (bioswales)
- Upper viewing terrace (+/- 10 short-term parking spaces)
- Surface parking lot (15 to 25 spaces)
- Playground (for school-aged children)
- Grass picnic area with shade structure
- Youth Environmental Education Center: restrooms, gathering space, outdoor education green, and terraced gardens
- Waterfront pathway with pedestrian and emergency vehicle access
- Restrooms (with green roof and interpretive/educational signage)
- Short-term marina parking (10 to 15 spaces) and dropoff area
- Removal of Piers 2 and 3
- Public dock with viewing platform and 14 transient moorage slips
- Integrated ADA accessible terraced walkway with stormwater feature
- Whaling Building: Historical/Cultural Maritime Center
- Enhanced hillside woodland (Removal of invasive species, preservation of significant trees, and planting of native forbs, shrubs and trees)
- Artificial swim beach with people propelled vessel launch
- Softened shoreline (improved nearshore habitat and addition of native riparian vegetation, including overhanging plants and woody debris)
- Trail connects Lake-to-Lake Trail system











ALTERNATIVE I: EDUCATIONAL EMPHASIS
















Park Program Elements

- Partially day-lighted stream

- Park viewing terrace and patio with gallery/exhibition space and parking below
- Playground (for school-aged children)
- Grass picnic area shaded by trees
- Shoreline boardwalk with pedestrian and emergency vehicle access
- Small seasonal vendor kiosks and restrooms
- Short-term marina parking (4 to 8 spaces) and dropoff area
- Removal of Piers 2 and 3, additional moorage on Pier I
- Shoreline elevated viewing platform (with elevator) to public dock
- Public dock with people propelled vessel launch and 14 transient moorage slips
- Main Street plaza / Bay view steps
- Atrium Cafe
- Tucked under canoe and kayak storage/rental, artist studios
- Tucked under parking structure (80 to 125 spaces)
- Whaling Building: Historical/Cultural Maritime Center
- Enhanced hillside woodland (Removal of invasive species, preservation of significant trees, and planting of native forbs, shrubs and trees)
- Softened shoreline (improved nearshore habitat and addition of native riparian vegetation, including overhanging plants and woody debris)
- Trail connects Lake-to-Lake Trail system














Ravine Corridor

- Ravine enhancements (Contiguous canopy forested areas to be retained and enhanced; invasive plants removed)





- Park viewing terrace
- Gallery/exhibition space and parking below (80 to 120 spaces)
- Surface parking lot with arbor (10 to 12 spaces)
- Enhanced hillside woodland (Removal of invasive species, preservation of significant trees, and planting of native forbs, shrubs and trees)


















Shoreline

- Playground (for school-aged children)
- Grass picnic area shaded by trees
- Shoreline boardwalk with pedestrian and emergency vehicle access
- Small seasonal vendor kiosks and restrooms
- Short-term marina parking (4 to 8 spaces) and dropoff area
- Removal of Piers 2 and 3, additional moorage on Pier I
- Public dock with people propelled vessel launch and 14 transient

- Trail connects Lake-to-Lake Trail system




















ALTERNATIVE 2: SHORELINE EMPHASIS















- Removal of Pier 3
- Public viewing pier with 14 transient moorage slips
- Main Street civic plaza with cascading water wall
- Public art piece
- Tucked under canoe and kayak storage/rental, artist studios
- Whaling Building: Historical/Cultural Maritime Center
- Enhanced hillside woodland (Removal of invasive species, preservation of significant trees, and planting of native forbs, shrubs and trees)














Ravine Corridor

- Enhanced hillside woodland (Removal of invasive species, preservation of significant trees, and planting of native forbs, shrubs and trees)















